1. 대화를 듣고, 두 사람이 구입할 손전등을 고르시오.

M: Hey, honey. What are you doing?

W: I'm looking at this electronics catalog. Remember you said we needed a flashlight?

M: Oh, yeah. That's right. Have you decided which one we're going to get?

W: Not yet. I need your opinion. Do you think we need one with a strap?

M: Yes. A strap would be nice. Which one are you looking at?

W: This one right here.

M: That one has four light bulbs. It doesn't have to be that bright. What about that one with three light bulbs?

W: Okay. That style comes in two models. One comes with two batteries and the other comes with one battery.

M: Then, let's get the model that uses only one battery.

W: That's a good choice, dear. We'll get that one.

3. 다음을 듣고, 무엇에 관한 설명인지 고르시오.

M: This is a field of scientific study of living things such as plants, animals, bacteria, and viruses. Scientists in this field ask questions like, “Why do living things interact with each other in particular ways?” and “How did they evolve?” Even today some of these questions remain unanswered. But continued study will lead toward a better understanding. Because this is such a wide field, it is divided into many branches. Some of these branches study the structure and form of living things, some study how the different parts of the body work together, and others study how organisms interact with other organisms.
